Training Course Updates

Following the introduction of the new WHS laws and regulations “Classified Plant” is now called “Registerable Plant.” AME followed suite and changed the course name to **Registerable Plant Awareness Training** alongside other vital changes to the curriculum.

The new WHS Act 2020 and WHS (Mining) Regulations 2022 came into effect on 31 March 2022 and replaced the previously applicable Mines Safety & Inspection Act 1994 and the associated Mines Safety & Inspections Regulations 1995.

If you own Registerable Plant, it is imperative to understand your registration and inspection requirements. The aim of our industry leading training course is to give you a fundamental understanding of Registerable Plant and associated registration and inspection obligations to remain compliant.

The course structure and existing key modules remain.

New Course Content

In addition to the existing course content, we will now also address and cover the following:

- Changes to classified plant requirements under schedule 5 of the WHS Mines Regs 2022 including the new exemptions to registration.
- The transition periods for plant registration either on or before commencement day.
- The new requirement for both design and plant registration in the mining sector.
- New definitions for what constitute a competent person.
- Who is allowed to conduct major inspections for mobile cranes?
- Section 5.2 The registration of plant.
- Changes to the Mine Management Structure, Mine Operators, Senior Site Executives and Statutory Supervisors.
- The implementation (if required), maintenance, review, audit, and continuous improvement of the Mine Safety Management System.
- There are no section 44 appointed person requirements in the new regs.
- Inspection requirements under the applicable standards for pressure vessels, mobile cranes, bridge cranes, gantry cranes and vehicle loading cranes.

- Inspection requirements for hoists and work platforms and the new exceptions for scissor lifts.
- Who can inspect, maintain, and keep records of registerable plant on a mine site?

The above list of updates does not necessarily represent all changes to our new course outline, but it provides you with a better idea about the main changes you need to be aware of.
