Training Course Updates

Following the introduction of the new WHS laws and regulations “Classified Plant” is now called “Registered Plant.” AME Training Services have changed the course name to **Registered Plant Awareness Training** to reflect this requirement.

The new WA WHS Act 2020 and WHS (General and Mining) Regulations 2022 came into effect on 31 March 2022 and replaced the previously applicable Mines Safety & Inspection Act 1994 and the associated Mines Safety & Inspections Regulations 1995.

If you are a person with management and control of plant, it is imperative to understand your registration and inspection requirements. The aim of our industry-leading training course is to give you a fundamental understanding of registered plant and associated registration and inspection obligations to remain compliant.

1. WHS Legislation Implementation, Exemptions and Transitional Savings Provisions.
2. Registered Plant, Management Systems Record Keeping Requirements.
